**Professor Simon Joss, International Eco-Cities Initiative,  
University of Westminster**

Simon Joss is Professor of Science & Technology Studies, and co-director of the International Eco-Cities Initiative, a joint initiative of the University of Westminster (London), The Johns Hopkins University (Baltimore, USA), and the Smithsonian Institution's Center for the Study of Invention and Innovation (Washington DC, USA). Simon's research focuses on the governance of environmental, economic and social sustainability, and related socio-technical systems. He is particularly interested in analysing, both theoretically and empirically, hybrid governance networks - such as public-private partnerships - and how these affect sustainability concepts and practices. A special focus of his work is on the governance of eco-city and smart systems innovation.

Simon's policy work has included membership of the Steering Group of the British Standards Institution's smart city framework (PAS 181), and membership of the UK-China Eco-cities and Green Building Group. He is an adviser to the Leibniz Dresden Graduate School on Ecological Urban and Regional Development, and chair of the UK's national Researcher Development Advisory Group (Vitae).
